CFP: Haskins Society at Kalamazoo 2018

The Haskins Society invites proposals for its sponsored sessions for the International Medieval Congress at Kalamazoo held 10-13 May 2018.

Long known as a forum for research into English and northern French history on either side of the Norman Conquest, as well as for a particular interest in the close study of chronicles and charters, the Haskins Society continues to build on its traditional base while actively seeking to include the latest scholarship on all aspects of the European experience between the early medieval period and the thirteenth century. While remaining broadly historical in its substantive and methodological orientations, the Society encourages interdisciplinary synergies and welcomes the contributions of researchers in the many disciplines that contribute to historical understanding.

We welcome proposals for complete sessions (three papers on a shared theme or problem) and for individual papers. In particular, we welcome proposals for “**New Voices in Medieval History**” which will feature papers by early career scholars (graduate students, untenured faculty, and independent scholars) who are eligible for the Denis Bethell Prize. How to submit: For individual papers, please send a 250 word abstract, c.v., and Participant Information Form (on the [Congress website](#)). For panel proposals, please send abstracts, c.v.'s, and PIF's for all panelists and a brief description of the panel's theme. Proposals should be sent to Prof. Nicholas Paul at npaul@fordham.edu. Proposals may be sent immediately and no later than Monday, September 12, 2017; the 2018 sessions will be finalized in late September. Prof. Paul welcomes expressions of interest (especially for whole panels) during the 2017 Congress; please email him.
